

# ServSafe Alcohol Program Roll-Out Guidelines:

## Vermont

### The ServSafe Alcohol program is currently <u>not approved</u> in Vermont.

Training in responsible alcohol service in Vermont is mandatory.

- All licensees are required to complete the Vermont Dept. of Liquor Control's "Liquor Control Licensee Enforcement Seminar" once every three years. No licenses will be renewed unless the department's records show that the licensee has complied with this requirement.
- Every employee involved in the sale or service of alcohol must complete a department approved alcohol server training course every two years. The licensee must keep a record of who was trained and through what program they were trained (using the form located at <a href="https://liquorcontrol.vermont.gov/education">https://liquorcontrol.vermont.gov/education</a>). Any licensee who fails to comply with these requirements may be subjected to a license suspension.
